






Dear friends in Christ,

Another busy year has passed, and we look forward to what lies ahead. As I did last year, I'll try to summarize the year for you. It is hard to believe that I've completed two year of full-time ministry here at Peace. It has been a joy and blessing to serve you, and I ask the Lord for continued blessings for Peace and for each one of you.

January of 2014 saw the start of my second year in ministry with the Baptism of Madelyn Deckard on



January 5. I also continued visits to Peace members and two ladies that I visited for St. Mark in West Bloomfield while they were without a pastor. There was also hospital visits to Peace members and my friend Donna Kyle, who I knew from my time at Evola Music. As I continued to work through my Seminary classes, long time member Frieda Flener passed on to heaven, and Pastor Merrell and I served at her funeral on April 2. Holy Week concluded with our Maundy Thursday Service, Good Friday Breakfast at the Big Apple, with service in the evening, and the joy of the resurrection and Easter Breakfast and service on Sunday the 20th.

On May 4, we confirmed Ben Robar, Lilleanna Poe, Daniel Penner, Marie Zangara, and Victoria VanderVelde. I continued to do services at Lakeland Place the second Sunday of the month and fill in where needed. Bob Poe and I attended the Doxology conference in DeWitt, MI from May 16 -18.

In June, we celebrated our Chicken BBQ on the 8th, and though the weather didn't allow us to celebrate worship outside, we did have a wonderful time, and much thanks to all who helped.

On July 13, I participated in the Ordination and Installation of Rev. Aaron Vergin as Pastor of St. Mark's Lutheran Church in West Bloomfield, while Pastor Merrell did the same for the Rev. Gary Koltz at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Lake Orion. Both men have been a great blessing to their respective churches and our circuit meetings. It is such a great pleasure to have a Pastor Emeritus in Pastor Merrell, who is available to help and always supportive of the ministry here at Peace. It also was he who suggested we adopt Houghton Elementary School as a church outreach. That has been a joy and blessings for Peace church and Houghton school alike. On August 2, I finished my final class and completed the SMP program at Concordia Theological Seminary. I received two A's and two B+'s for the year. I finished the month with the Baptism of Gibson Brown on August 24.
