

PASTOR

Dear friends in Christ,

It is the beginning of my fifth year in ministry here at Peace as your Pastor. How has life here at Peace changed in the last four years? I looked at worship attendance for mid-January over the last four years. In 2013, we had 95, in 2014 – 88, in 2015 – 72, in 2016 – 69 and last weekend we had 57. This is not encouraging. Of the attendance drop, 38 from 2013 to 2017, 24 were members who regularly attended worship and have passed on to heaven, while a few who also had attended regularly have moved away or are dealing with serious and long- term illnesses. How should we view this? I believe that we need to look at this through the eyes of hope. It is the Lord's Church, and in His way and in His time, He is still in control.

We have been blessed to be sustained by Him over these last four years. What has changed? Well, just over the last few years, God has opened our worship services to four settings from the Divine Service of the Lutheran Service Book, as well as the Service of Prayer and Preaching and Confession and Absolution that we've used throughout the last four years for midweek services.

God has brought us Katherine Nold, an organist of great talent, skill and dedication; though we might not have seen His hand at work in her coming to Peace. In hindsight, we can see clearly God's directing, and we as His people have been blessed by it. God also has given us an exceptional organ for a small installation cost that has enhanced our worship and music and brought the blessings of our Liturgy to its full potential. You will not find better music offered in the Divine Service anywhere. Preaching? Probably ... but music ... no!

We have a new Sanctuary Cross that was built by member Doug Marquardt. This brought into our worship life the cross high and lifted up down to eye level and a seasonal decoration. It enhances our time together and brings an object lesson into view each time we enter the Sanctuary.

The new padded chairs in the fellowship hall, a gift from Marilynn Wendt, remind us all of the comforts in Christ as we serve Him ... or at least it keeps our backsides from aching while we continue to do the Lord's work through the years ahead. Jay Squanda, Matt Rich, Bob Poe and Jim Rich have also become active in teaching Bible Study for our intergenerational Bible Class. While we have not seen as many children, we still had an average of 12—18 people in attendance! Children cannot drive, so their lack of attendance is largely due to their parents or guardians not coming or being unable to come. Thankfully, we have Elise and Beth ready to teach when and if they do come.

Advent by Candlelight, Chicken BBQ, Easter Breakfast and Midweek Bible Study all continue to bring opportunities for us to invite others and share the joy we have in Jesus. Serving the needs of the church is made available for members by elected officers on many congregational boards and by service guild members.

What is the Easter Vigil?

The Easter Vigil is a special Liturgy used to celebrate Easter. It takes place on the evening of Holy Saturday, the day before Easter. It may have been celebrated in Jerusalem already by the second century, and it soon spread to the rest of the Church.

Timing of the service ...

Perhaps the first question that might occur to someone is, "How can we celebrate Easter on Saturday?" Christ rose on Sunday. However, in Jesus' day, people reckoned time differently than we do today. One day ended and a new day began at dusk (6:00 pm). This is why the Jewish leaders were in such a hurry to get the bodies down from the cross (John 19:31) and why Joseph and Nicodemus were in such a hurry to bury Jesus' body (Luke 23:55, 56).

Based on this way of reckoning time, the first day of the week, the day of Jesus' resurrection, began at dusk the evening before. By the time the women arrived at the tomb "early in the morning" and "before it was light" the stone had already been rolled away, and Jesus was gone (Luke 24:1, John 20:1). By this time, Jesus had also completed his post-resurrection descent into hell (1 Peter 3:18, 19). All of this happened before the sun rose on Sunday morning. Therefore, celebrating Jesus' resurrection already on Saturday after dusk is entirely appropriate.
