

Easter joy to all of you as we live in the resurrection and eternal life that Christ won!

"But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. For as by a man came death, by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead" (1 Corinthians 15:20-21 ESV). The Apostle Paul here brings the eternal hope to the Corinthian congregation that their faith, in fact, is not futile but hopeful, and those who have died in Christ will be raised.

Easter brings, for me, a remembrance of those dear members who have gone to be with the Lord and my dear family members that I miss. Death is real; we all feel the loss in our lives. It is also the real hope of a resurrection eternity together.

This week, April 15, a member of Peace, that many of you won't know, went to be with the Lord. John Stade was a neighbor of Veretta Cheal, at Elmhaven Manor, where they both lived. I met and visited with him at Veretta's request. When John moved to Clarkston Specialty for greater care, I continued to visit him. John was confirmed at Gethsemane Lutheran in Rochester and had been away from regular attendance for many years. As one in spiritual need, the Lord used this time and this way to reconnect John to Himself, His gifts, and our church.

Each month, I was privileged to bring John the news at church and the gifts of the Lord's forgiveness, whether he was in his bed or wheelchair. I last saw John after church on Sunday April 15; he had been in hospice care and declining health. I came back on Tuesday, April 17, and found his room empty; John was not there. I checked with a nurse to obtain some information, but she was new and didn't know John or any way to help. The receptionist gave me some information about a memorial, but no visitation or viewing was planned. He was just gone, and I couldn't find him. I shed a tear at the loss of a friend of five years. It reminded me of Mary Magdalene at the tomb from John 20. *"But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb, and as she wept she stooped to look into the tomb. And she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had lain, one at the head and one at the feet. They said to her, 'Woman, why are you weeping?' She said to them, 'They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him''' (John 20:11-13).*

Loss brings emotion and tears. Jesus Himself comforts Mary, who didn't recognize Him but mistook Him for the gardener, with His words: "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you seeking? Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, 'Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away.' Jesus said to her, "Mary." She turned and said to him in Aramaic, 'Rabboni!'" (which means Teacher). Jesus said to her, "Do not cling to Me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father; but go to My brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to My Father and your Father, to my God and your God'" (John 20:15-17).

This Jesus is God of the living and the dead for those who remain in the flesh and for all who have died in Christ; like John Stade and our entire dear loved ones waiting for the blessed hope of Christ's reappearing. This hope is not in vain. It is a joyful hope of anticipation – one where the tears of loss are replaced with tears of joy and a life eternal that Christ Himself promises us all.

John Stade is no longer there for me to visit, but we will be reunited one day in Christ. This is the Lord's promise. He is risen, and we, too, will rise!
