
Annual chicken BBQ is a hit




Just remember that during vacations and weekend getaways, you're especially missed by your friends at church. The work of the church suffers because no one can fill your place quite like you.





QUATREFOIL

The word quatrefoil comes from the Latin for "four leaves." A guatrefoil in art or architecture is the outline of four partially overlapping circles of the same diameter. In Christian tradition, it represents the writers of the four gospels -Matthew, Mark, Luke and John which overlap one another partially but not entirely, and are equally important to our understanding of Jesus, as inspired by the Holy Spirit.

What does the word "Amen" mean?

You probably recognize this word from hearing or seeing it at the end of prayers. Maybe you use it in your prayers every morning when you wake up and every night when you go

to sleep. Well, the word "Amen" is Hebrew for

"certainly" or "truly." Martin Luther went so far as to say that "Amen" really means, "Yes, yes, it shall be so."

Why do we use it? God commands us to pray. When we use the word "Amen" at the end of our prayers, we are letting God know that we truly believe that He will hear and answer all of our prayers just as He has promised! What a great way to end a prayer! FOR PARENTS

Point out that Jesus often used the word "Amen" in Scripture when He said things like: "Truly, truly (literally, "Amen, amen") I say to you . . ." Encourage your children to be listening for and saying the word "Amen" at appropriate points in the service. In what places besides prayer do we hear "Amen" used?
