

Our next blood drive is coming in September



Our next blood drive is set for September 10, 2015 from 2:00 — 7:45 p.m.

With summer comes a significant increase in the number of a variety of accidents, which leads to a need for an increase in the number of units of blood.

If you have not given blood before, be assured it is safe. The American Red Cross must follow safe withdrawal procedures, as well as using safe measures during and following the giving of blood. Most donors feel a little discomfort for a few seconds at the needle insertion point. Donors are required to stay for a short period after giving, and they are given a drink and snack. Peace members generally provide extra-special, yummy snacks (including pie and popcorn!) in addition to the ones provided by the American Red Cross. Once the staff is sure you are feeling well, you are allowed to leave. It's that simple!

So, if you've given before, give again! If you've never given, why not try? You will save lives! And, the recipients are extremely grateful, appreciative, glad, obliged, etc.! They are thankful you care enough to give of your time and blood!





What is the "Sanctus"?

The Sanctus (pronounced sahnk-TOOS) is a hymn of praise, which is sung during the order of Holy Communion. The word "sanctus" is the Latin word for "holy." The Sanctus

begins with the words "Holy, holy, holy! Lord

God of power and might: Heaven and earth are full of your glory." In this first part, we sing the same words sung by the angels in Isaiah 6. These words tell of the great glory of our God who has come to be with us. In the second part of the Sanctus, we sing the words "Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest." These words from Psalm 118 were sung by the crowds when Christ rode into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday.

Why do we sing the Sanctus? The words of the Sanctus proclaim that our

The Sanctus is a wonderful part of the Divine Service which proclaims the presence of Christ in the Sacrament while praising God and confessing the complete unity of God's faithful Church in every time and place. Encourage your children to sing the Sanctus with the congregation. Remind them that Jesus is really here and that they are singing the Sanctus with people and spiritual beings they can't even see!

Savior Jesus Christ comes to be with us physically in his very body and blood for the forgiveness of our sins. He is really and truly present in the Sacrament of Holy Communion! When we sing the Sanctus, the angels in heaven along with those who have died in the faith join with us in a combined hymn of praise to God. Wow! That is pretty fantastic stuff!
