It was a nice summer and a nice time for family and reflection. Much has happened since we began our summer schedule. We have and are continuing to be blessed here at Peace. We have a new organist, Katherine Nold. She is a wonderful organist and Christian young woman who plays beautifully and has great joy serving the Lord. Why do we worship on Sunday?

Do you remember on which day of the week Jesus rose from the dead? If you guessed "Sunday," then you are right! Sunday is called "the Lord's Day" because it directs our attention to Jesus' resurrection from the dead, not to mention the many other miraculous events

in the early Christian Church that took place on Sunday. For example, the Holy Spirit the disciples on a Sunday at

was sent to the disciples on a Sunday at Pentecost.

For how long have Christians worshiped on Sundays? We know from the Bible that the very first Christians met on Sundays to hear God's Word and celebrate Holy Communion (Acts 20:7, 1 Corinthians 16:2). Though Christians in different regions of the world would sometimes worship on days other than Direct your children to the significance and importance found in having a special day the Lord's Day—set

the Lord's Day—set aside for receiving God's wonderful gifts through Word and Sacrament.

Sunday, by A.D. 325 most Christians set Sunday aside for worship because they considered it "the Lord's Day." So every time you go to church on Sunday, you are doing the same thing that Christians did all the way back in the beginning of Christianity! Wow! What a great tradition we share with our Christian ancestors!
