

The year long celebration of the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation, or the return of the freedom of the Gospel, is now upon us! As Martin Luther said at the Diet of Worms:

"Since then your sere Majesty and your Lordships seek a simple answer, I will give it in this manner, neither horned nor toothed. Unless I am convinced by the testimony of the Scriptures or by clear reason (for I do not trust either in the Pope or in Councils alone, since it is well known that they have often erred and contradicted themselves), I am bound by the Scriptures I have quoted and my conscience is captive to the Word of God. I cannot and I will not recant anything, since it is neither safe nor right to go against conscience. May God help me. Amen."

(Reply to the Diet of Worms, April 18, 1521)

We also stand, as Luther did, looking at what is before us. How, and for whom will you vote? What will be your motive? It is my hope that, just as Luther, we all will be **captive to the word of God** in how we come to our decisions.

There is much to dislike with the choices set before us. But, there is also much, as we turn to the pages of Holy Scripture, to give us hope. In many places God uses those whom mortal minds would have discarded. Moses needed Aaron to speak for him. David was the least likely of the brothers to be King. However, God saw something special because God looked at David's heart. Jeremiah was in his own eyes only a youth, but God promised to give him the words he needed to speak. In John the Baptist, the Apostles Peter and Paul, and on and on, we see God use those we would not have chosen for the tasks appointed. But, as Saint Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 3:18-23:

¹⁸ Let no one deceive himself. If anyone among you thinks that he is wise in this age, let him become a fool that he may become wise. ¹⁹ For the wisdom of this world is folly with God. For it is written, "He catches the wise in their craftiness," ²⁰ and again, "The Lord knows the thoughts of the wise, that they are futile." ²¹ So let no one boast in men. For all things are yours, ²² whether Paul or Apollos or Cephas or the world or life or death or the present or the future—all are yours, ²³ and you are Christ's, and Christ is God's.

The favor of God on account of Christ is yours, given as a gift by grace through faith (Eph. 2:8-9). For many of us received the gift of faith through the waters of Holy Baptism, being marked and redeemed by God as his child. Luther knew this too and had to stand firm in that confession or stand in the hope of Popes and Councils. We must always stand in this life as Christ's child, captive to the word of God in how we live, think, act, and vote. It is incumbent for us as Christians, as we consider decisions in life, to look always to the Word of God for wisdom and guidance. Wherever your conscience leads you as you consider the choices before you, may you ever be captive to the Word of God. God help us all. Amen.

"Verbum Domini Manet in Aeternum"



Latin for "The Word of the Lord Endures Forever," this motto of the Lutheran Reformation is based on Isaiah 40:6-8 and quoted by 1 Peter 1:25. Frederick the Wise, ruler of Saxony and one of Martin Luther's earliest and most powerful defenders, had the VDMA symbol sewn into the right sleeve of the official garments of his court. It was also used on flags, banners, swords, and uniforms as a symbol of the unity of

the Lutheran laity who struggled to defend their beliefs, families, and lives against those who were intent on destroying them.

The long view of Advent First Sunday in Advent 11/27/16

Advent is about preparing not only for Christmas but also for Jesus' return. According to Scripture, that won't be the calm, silent scene described in Christmas carols.

In 1928, Dietrich Bonhoeffer preached: "It is very remarkable that we face the thought that God is coming so calmly, whereas previously peoples trembled at the day of God We have become so accustomed to the idea of divine love and of God's coming at Christmas that we no longer feel the shiver of fear that God's coming should arouse in us. We ... [forget] the serious aspect that the God of the world draws near to the people of our little earth and lays claim to us."

God is love; we'll be in good hands at the end of time. However, during Advent, also be in awe of God. Embrace a reverent fear of the Lord that reminds you how profound it is that God chooses again and again to draw near and lay claim to you.
